Dear Parents, Carers and friends of St Michael's,



It is that time of year where emotions and stress levels may be heightened due to assessments demands. Exams in particular are pretty much always stressful. However, it is entirely possible to manage some of the stress that is brought on by exams if students use different strategies or get some help. This will be useful if:

- You have to do exams.
- Exams stress you out.
- You have trouble planning or concentrating on study.
- You need help with some subjects which you are studying.
- You need help planning your time.

### Exams are a hassle

Very few people enjoy doing exams and cramming information into your brain over a short period of time is stressful. A bit of stress can get you going but too much can make you exhausted, angry and annoyed.

### Tackling exams

There are a number of different strategies you can employ to help you get through exams the best way that you can.

### Manage your stress

You will be less stressed if you have a good idea of how the lead-up to your exams is going to look. Plan what you are going to study and when, and stick it up on the wall or on your desktop. Break it down into manageable chunks and start working through it at the rate that you planned. It is probably more boring at the start but will be far less stressful in the long run. Plan some break times too.

### Take the pressure off

Deal with pressure and expectations by realistically assessing how you think you will go, and working to do the best you can. If other people's expectations are pressuring you, talk to them and try to get them to ease up on you. If you are putting too much pressure on yourself, you need to be realistic and maintain some perspective.

### Do it together

There will be other people studying for the same exam and they probably don't like having to lock themselves away to study any more than you do. Get together with them and take the books outside from time to time. If you are not as strong in certain areas, it could help to talk to other students as well. If you are good at a particular subject then share the brain-wealth.

### Get enough sleep, eat good food, and keep moving

It is really important that you look after your physical health when studying for exams. Make sure that you stop to eat regular meals and try to set aside 30 minutes a day to do some exercise, even if it is just going for a walk. Having enough sleep is also really important to allow you to perform at your best and manage your stress.

### Have options

Make sure that you do not pin all your hopes on one outcome. Have a few options, and realise that if your heart is set on one thing there are always going to be other paths to it.

### If you are really stressed

If you are finding things tough, ask for help. Your teachers and Guidance Counsellors can help.

### What can I do now?

- Grab a notebook and start planning study as well as activity breaks.
- Take regular breaks as it actually helps you to study more effectively.
- Try practicing meditation to help you relax.



### **Uniform 2018**

Last week I wrote to Year 9 parents on the uniform changes for Year 10 2018. The Year 10s of 2018 were the first group of Year 7s into secondary and will be the first to undergo the new Senior system.

In recognition of the students maturing as well as Year 10 becoming part of the Senior school it is important that this is not just given lip service but is also identified and acknowledged visually. Therefore, it will be the College's expectation that all Year 10 students (along with Year 11 and Year 12) in Term 2 and Term 3, come to school dressed in the Senior winter uniform which consists of the Senior College tie, blazer and slacks for our young men and the blazer and senior tie for our young women.

Both the College Board and College P & F have been consulted and are in support of the change. Students will have the opportunity for three years wear rather than the current situation.

In earlier additions of the newsletter I wrote to all parents to outline the College's expectations in relation to uniform in 2018. I again take this opportunity to outline these expectations, to allow all parents and students the necessary time to ensure that all students present with the correct uniform on day one of 2018.

There is an expectation that all students come to school dressed and groomed according to the uniform code. The way our students wear their uniform is a direct reflection of the expectations set by our College community. Their presentation reflects the pride and sense of belonging that derives from being in a school community with high standards. Additionally, a clear and supported uniform code is about treating all students equitably.

A reminder that Converse, Vans and other recreational 'jogger style' shoes will not be compliant with the uniform code. The sport shoe required for 2018 is either a cross trainer or running shoe that contains arch support. Please be aware of this requirement when purchasing shoes for 2018.

Additionally, the College Sport jacket will no longer be permitted to be worn with the College Formal uniform. The Formal uniform is just that, a "Formal Uniform" and students will be expected to wear the College Formal V neck jumper or for senior students, the College Blazer during the winter months.

The aim of our College dress code is to enable all students to dress neatly, smartly, economically and appropriately for their work at school. I thank parents for their support in this regard and I look forward to your continued support in 2018.

### **Year 12 Farewells**

I would like to congratulate the Year 12 students in the way in which they conducted themselves during the last ever school exams. All students were focused and gave it their best. I look forward to the up & coming events of this week to farewell all of our Year 12s in a dignified and respectful manner to which they are deserving.
