Dear Parents, Carers and friends of St Michael's,

There were many great events across our first week back for term 3. Our Year 10s had a wonderful time away at their camp and both our Year 8s and Year 11s experienced a Reflection Day where they had the opportunity to better understand their relationship with God and each other. I would like to thank all of the staff who freely gave their time to support our students.

Our St Michael's College Oz Tag teams competed at the Sunshine Coast last weekend. I would like to congratulate our Girls who finished 5th in Division 1 and our boys who won the Division 2 Grand Final to bring home the Oz Tag plate! Thank you to all of our dedicated staff who gave up many early mornings and their weekend to support our students.

Congratulations to all of our Kokoda Challenge teams who completed this challenging 52km trek. I would like to thank Mrs Mullaly, Mr May and Miss Zorn for their work with supporting our teams. Special mention must go to Andre Jones-Dorr who again provided support for our teams. Andre has made a huge effort over a number of years to welcome our teams as they finish this gruelling trek. I would also like to thank Chemist Warehouse and Nicole Hickey for providing financial support for our teams.

Later today, some of our Social Justice Committee will meet with The Hon. Mr Steven Ciobo MP, the Minister for Trade, Tourism and Investment and Federal Member for Moncrieff to discuss their concerns over new coal mining developments and the threat to our Great Barrier Reef. I would like to thank Mrs McGeough-Beach and our Social Justice committee for taking up this challenge.

Last year, we took our teaching staff to the Jewish Synagogue for a special Holocaust exhibit. As I have mentioned previously, one of my reasons for my recent overseas travel was to look at our Justice Pillar through the lens of the Jewish Holocaust (Shoah). At our last assembly, I spoke with our students about my visit to Dachau Concentration Camp outside of Munich, Germany.



Dachau was a concentration camp for political prisoners, rather than an extermination centre like Auswitz and other places that led to the deaths of more than 6 million Jews and millions of Gypsies and others.

In Dachau, amongst many other dissenters and those deemed to be against the Nazi regime's beliefs, there were over 3000 Catholic clergy, including Bishops, who had stood up against the Nazi regime. Over 1000 Catholic clergy died there. Our guide

had said that if the inmates were willing to realign their views with that of the Nazi regime, that they could be released from the starvation and endless cycle of work and suffering.



I spoke to the students about the nature of dealing with injustice and about these clergy following Christ's message of peace, justice and love, even though it meant suffering and death. I challenged our students that whilst they are not being called to this same level of sacrifice, that we need to continue to be people of justice, even when this is not the popular position. In our year of Justice, as we try and "Give Colour to the Invisible" and "Restore the Balance" we need to lend our voice to justice (giving colour), rather than trying to hide away (being invisible).

Just near the crematorium, there is now a beautiful statue of an inmate with his hands in his pockets. This would have been punishable by torture and possibly death as it was deemed as an act of defiance within the camp. It shows that justice and truth cannot be bowed by injustice and evil.

Students have overwhelmingly presented well for school by wearing their correct uniform and happily greeting their teachers and enquiring about their holiday. A positive start such as this sets up the students for a successful term.

As well as being smartly and correctly presented for school it is most important to be punctual and to bring all the necessary equipment for each class. As well as bringing the correct equipment to class students are encouraged to bring the correct attitude to their studies. Attendance and attitude are the keys to success!
